~In follow up to our January 10 Village Residents' Association Meeting

Staff will call 911 if you have fallen and can't get up and your condition is questionable for injury or serious illness. You do have the right to refuse to be transported by Ambulance. It can be unsafe for friends and family to transport you in an emergency situation.

~One of the best ways to make sure your wishes are carried out is the POLST form.

The **POLST form (hot pink)**: stands for Physician's Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment, and is needed to protect a person from unwanted emergency medical care like **CPR** or transfer to a hospital. It doesn't mean you won't be treated for other conditions. **It is you and your doctors' orders.** This is one of the most important documents to have on your refrigerator. (In plastic sheath)

It requires your physician's signature, who then registers it with the Oregon POLST registry. Ambulances and Hospitals have access to this document unless you "Opt Out". Ask your Doctor.

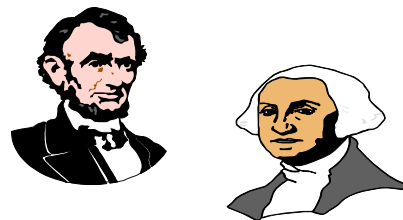

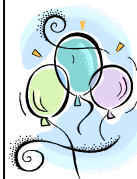
